Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of **NIRVAANRAJ ENERGY PRIVATE LIMITED**, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March 2023, and the statement of Profit and Loss for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March, 2023 and its profit/loss for the year ended on that date,

- a) In the case of the balance sheet, of the state of affairs of the company as at March 31, 2023
- b) In the case of the Profit and Loss Account, of the profit for the period ended on that date and

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Accounting Standards (AS) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.



Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the standalone financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the standalone financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

Reporting of key audit matters as per SA 701, Key Audit Matters are not applicable to the Company as it is an unlisted company.

Information other than the financial statements and auditors' report thereon

The Company's board of directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards (AS) specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

Materiality is the magnitude of misstatements in the standalone financial statements that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the standalone financial statements may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the standalone financial statements.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards. From the matters communicated with those charged with governance, we determine those matters that were of most significance in the audit of the financial statements of the current period and are therefore the key audit matters. We describe these matters in our auditor"s report unless law or regulation precludes public disclosure about the matter or when, in extremely rare circumstances, we determine that a matter should not be communicated in our report because the adverse consequences of doing so would reasonably be expected to outweigh the public interest benefits of such communication.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- This report does not include a statement on the matters specified in paragraph 3 and 4 of the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order 2020 ("the Order"), issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub-section (11) of section 143 of the Companies Act, 2013, since in our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the said order is not applicable to the company.

A) Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The Company prepares its accounts on accrual basis following the historical cost convention and on the basis of going concern in compliance with the provisions of section 211(3c){Companies (Accounting standards) rules,2006 as amended} and the other relevant provisions of The Companies Act, 1956 which, as per a clarification issued by the ministry of corporate affairs, continue to apply under section 133 of Companies Act, 2013 (which has superseded section 211(3c) of the companies act,1956 w.e.f. 12 September, 2013).

Accounting policies adopted in the preparation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year except for the change in accounting policy explained below.

All assets & liabilities have been classified as current & non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle & other criteria set out in Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013.Based on the nature of products & the time between acquisition of assets for processing & their realization in cash & cash equivalents, the company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current/non current classification of assets & liabilities.

2. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialized.

3. Property, Plant & Equipments

Fixed Assets are stated at cost net of GST, value added tax, cenvat and includes amounts added on revaluation, less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any. All costs, including financing costs till commencement of commercial production, net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the fixed assets are capitalized.

4. Change in Accounting Policies

(i) Assets for a value not exceeding Rs.5000:

The Depreciation on assets value not exceeding Rs.5000 which was written off in the year of purchase as per erstwhile Companies Act, 1956 are being charged on the basis of their useful lives prescribed in the Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

5. Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies, if any, are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction or that approximates the actual rate at the date of the transactions.

6. Inventories

Items of inventories are measured at lower of cost and net realizable value after providing for obsolescence, if any. Cost of inventories comprises of cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing them to their respective present location and condition. Cost of raw materials, process chemicals, stores and spares, packing materials and other consumable valued at cost and work in progress, finished goods and consignment stock are valued at Cost or NRV whichever is less.

7. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized on accrual basis when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection.

8. Taxes on Income

Tax on income for the current period is determined on the basis of taxable income & tax credits computed in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act 1961, and based on expected outcome of assessments /appeals.

Deferred Tax is recognized on timing difference between the accounting income & taxable income for the year & reversal /adjustment of earlier years deferred tax assets /liabilities which are quantified using the tax rates & laws enacted or substantively enacted as on Balance Sheet date.

Deferred Tax Liabilities are recognized for all taxable timing difference. Deferred tax assets are recognized and carried forward only to the extent that that there is a virtual certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such Deferred Tax Assets can be realized. Deferred Tax Liability are assessed at each Balance Sheet date.

9. Employee Benefits

(a) Provident Fund

The company's policy with respect to the treatment of Company's contribution is that the provident fund being in the nature of defined contribution plan is being charged to Statement of Profit & Loss Accounts in the period during which services are rendered by employees.

(b) Bonus

Company's paid minimum bonus if any, to employees required to pay as per section 10 of Payment of Bonus Act, 1965 on accrual basis which is being charged to the statement of Profit & Loss Accounts in the period during which services are rendered by employees.

10. Borrowing Cost

Borrowing cost that is attributable to the acquisition, constructions or production of qualifying assets is capitalized as part of cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is an asset that necessarily requires a substantial period of times to get ready for its intended use or sale. All other borrowing cost are recognized as an expenses in the period in which they are incurred

11. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent liabilities and assets are not recognized due to there were no such assets and liabilities as on Balance Sheet date.

12. Earning Per Shares (EPS)

Basic Earning per Shares are calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attribute to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per shares, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of share outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effect of all dilutive potential equity shares.

13. Depreciation & Amortizations

(i) Depreciation of tangible assets

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Written Down value method using the useful lives of assets & in the manner prescribed in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

(ii) Amortizations

Company started written off 20% of its Preliminary & Preoperative exp from this year.

14. Cash & Cash Equivalent

Cash & Cash Equivalents comprise cash at bank & cash/cheque in hand.

15. Provision for interest

Provision for interest on cash credit limit availed from Bank has been done on the basis amount actually debited by the bank.

16. Balance confirmations:

Debtors and creditors balances are subject to confirmation.
